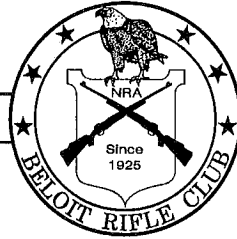

What a busy year we have had at your club in spite of the tropical summer we had with the torrid heat and humidity we all dealt with.

After many hours of volunteer work from the members our range is looking great. The 'no blue sky' has been completed, roofs are sealed and lawn has been regraded and seeded. The installation of new electrical poles, electrical service, lights and warning system for the main range is completed. Our SECURITY system and card access is completed.

At our work party we had 27 or 28 members there helping at the range—painting, staining, cutting down overhanging tree branches. The BIGGEST project completed was moving over 1200 tires (previously used as backstops at 25, 50, 100 yard target areas) from our temporary holding area to the front of our range so a recycle company can pick them up and haul them to their facilities for recycling. 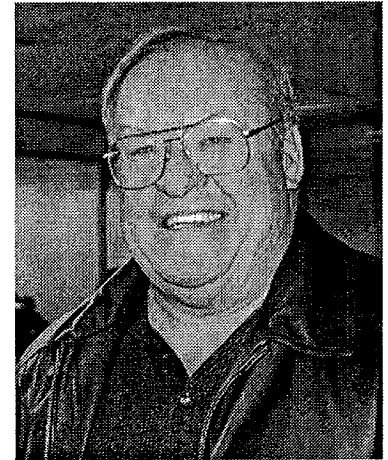

The new range is being heavily used before hunting season. Safety on the range is extremely important. I don't know if some of you can't read or just think the rules are not for you. I wrote in the last newsletter, when going down range to replace or remove targets you must be sure all members on the firing line have placed their guns in the racks with actions open before you turn on the warning lights. When you return you have to walk and look to be sure that there is no open still down range. You can't see the entire firing line from the switch. The person who turns the lights on is the person who is responsible for turning them off. **Do Not Take Someone Else's Word For It!!** Anyone not obeying this will be brought before the board and it will not be a good day for you. Safety comes first. You belong to one of the best ranges there is. Keep it that way.

Cold weather is on the way, get out and enjoy the range and meet new friends.

From the "Membership" Desk

The annual reminder regarding membership responsibilities for both dues paying members and the potential new members that you are sponsoring. Regarding new members, any one sponsoring a person for membership, must get the application to us before February 1, 2012. Any applications turned in after that date will be for the "2013" membership group.

Now, regarding current members, a few reminders. Your current key card will not work after February 5, 2012. You need to pay your dues to get your key updated and new membership card. I have included a payment schedule so that you can determine your cost for renewal.

As you can see, if you work no hours at all, your dues are \$200.00. Each hour you work reduces your dues by \$15.00. If you are a first year member, you must have eight hours of work. Without these hours, you will not be renewed. After the mandatory eight hours, use the above chart to determine your dues.

PAYMENT OF DUES:

You will notice that there is a "SPECIAL ASSESSMENT" charge. This will be charged to all members. Life members will be included in this "SPECIAL ASSESSMENT" charge. Most of the payment of dues occurs at the spaghetti dinner, February 5, 2012. It is important to remember, once again, that your range key will not work after February 5, 2012. You need to get your key updated. The replacement for any key card that is lost is \$20.00.

If you cannot make the first collection, there will be some alternate dates for you to renew. I have included a chart of the alternate payment days and the times of collection for each of those days.

These dates and times will be posted on the entrance gates. When you find that your key does not work because you have not renewed, check for the next renewal time and date.

We are also requesting that payments be made by check or money order, when ever possible. **Remember:** Your dues will be due, at the very latest, by the April club meeting, which will be April 04, 2012.

RENEWAL THROUGH THE MAIL:

This was discussed by the board at the June Meeting and was approved in the manner as listed below. If you exercise this option to pay your dues, you **MUST** follow the steps listed. Failure to do so could result in loss of membership:

2011 Membership Card, with credited work hours.

Keys, The card key will not need to be sent in when mailing in your card and money. When your dues are received and processed, the card will once again be made active.

Photocopy Of Your Current NRA Membership Status, (Mailing label from your magazine has all this information, just clip and send)

Dues Payment(See Dues table - Check/Money Order Only - NO CASH!)

+ \$5.00 Mail-in Handling FEE (just add this to your dues payment - membership will NOT be processed without this fee)

If above conditions are not met, your membership will be held and not processed until they are.

This option should be exercised only as a last resort. We will make every effort to process the mail renewals as quickly as possible. Realize that this position, like all others on the board, are voluntary and that income generating positions that we all hold and the demands that those "paying jobs" make, may cause some delays. This is the seventh year for mail renewal; I suspect that a processing time of one to two weeks should be expected, as it seemed to work out well for that time in the past years.

REPEATING!!

February 1, 2012 is the final date to turn in new membership applications. Make sure they are filled out completely! Two valid signatures and a valid NRA number. If either of these items is missing, or determined to not be valid, the application will be returned! The new member will then have to wait until next year to begin the application process. Please be careful with these items.

REPEATING!!

The Board has decided that since current members have five (5) opportunities to come to the club to pay their dues and have mail in opportunity to pay dues, any member not paying their dues by the first Wednesday in April, 2012, will be required to go through the new member application process, if they wish to continue their membership.

We are doing some upgrades to the archery section of our club. Currently we are making upgrades to the walk through course. We've added color markers to the shooting lanes, which consist of colored bricks placed at 20, 30, and 40 yards where applicable. These bricks are dug into the center of each lane. The 20 yard bricks are painted orange, 30 yard bricks are painted green, and the only 40 yard brick is painted yellow. I have added 5 additional shooting lanes marked by blue ribbons, these lanes are **NOT TO BE MODIFIED IN ANY WAY** if you don't like the way they are laid out shoot from the wide open paths (these lanes are meant to represent real hunting shots that you might encounter in the woods while traveling to and from your favorite stand). We will be working on adding additional lanes in the upcoming months, if you have any ideas on adding lanes or additional targets please feel free to contact Jeff Schroeder at 608-931-0369.

NRA Membership is required and **NRA NUMBER MUST BE ON THIS FORM!** It is your responsibility to apply for and maintain that membership. Failure to do so represents loss of club membership. Please give a brief reason for joining the Beloit Rifle Club and list some skills that might benefit the club:

Sponsorship: It will be necessary for an applicant to have two (2) sponsors. Sponsors may sponsor another candidate the following year, provided their current applicant is not called before the board for any infraction during the **1st** year of their probationary period. If this happens, sponsors will lose the right to sponsor a new member for **12** months from date of conviction of the above mentioned infraction. Sponsors are required to attend any board disciplinary actions involving the applicant.

Probationary Period/Membership Status: This period will last for two (2) years from the renewal date. No applicant may sponsor a new member until full membership status is attained. A background check may be conducted and the information gathered will be used to determine the membership status of the applicant

Work Requirement: During the first year of probationary membership, all applicants will be required to do eight (8) hours of service for the club. These hours are in addition to the work hours, up to eight (8), that may be credited to dues reduction, at the current rate of \$15.00 per hour.

NRA PLEDGE: I certify that I am a citizen of good repute of the United States of America. That I am not a member of any organization or group having as its purpose, or one of its purposes, the overthrow by force and violence, the government admitted to membership, I will fulfill the obligations of good sportsmanship and good citizenship.

I have read the Beloit Rifle Club rules and agree to obey them. My sponsors and I have reviewed the club facilities and I understand the operating procedure on each range.

MEMBERSHIP PROCEDURE:

1.

Applications must be turned in before the first of February of the year in which you wish to become a member. You do not need to come to the Spaghetti dinner, that is for the collection of dues of current members.

2.

A letter will be sent to all potential new members in February inviting them to the March meeting. Each new member who wishes to join the club is required to attend that meeting.

3.

At the March meeting an orientation session will be provided by the various disciplines, the membership directors, grounds keepers and chief range officer. Each person will emphasize the factors of SAFE range operation, as it applies to their discipline.

4.

New member induction takes place at this March meeting of the Beloit Rifle Club. Your dues are payable at this time and it is also the time when you will get your membership card and key(s). Dues will be collected at end of a short club meeting.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

You must be a member of the National Rifle Association. You must have a membership number from the National Rifle Association. That number must be on the front side of this document. Putting the words "**Applied For**", where the NRA membership number should be will cause this application to be mailed back to you. Do not return it until the NRA membership number is added. Send **NO MONEY** with the application. **Remember the February First application due date. The Beloit Rifle Club takes in members only once a year, in March.**

SUGGESTION 1: Make a photocopy of this document and the completed membership application for your records.

SUGGESTION 2: Make sure that you know your sponsor; they are responsible for showing you the facilities and getting you a current rule book.
